Case Study

Northeastern Town Mayoral Campaign

Campaign window: 10 days

Audience: 3,432 low-propensity voters

Goal: Mobilization GOTV



Ten days before a 2025 mayoral election in a mid-size Northeastern town, the campaign partnered with PubSent to deliver a bilingual SMS GOTV program targeting 3,432 low-propensity voters.

Campaign Objectives

- Drive turnout among voters who typically vote for candidates party, but skip local races.
- Run multiple bilingual SMS conversations that secure vote commitments and resolve questions in real time.
- Uphold strict compliance by embedding clear opt-out language in every initial text, maximizing efficiency across subsequent touches.



PubSent is an Al-powered conversational SMS platform that lets campaigns and nonprofits run compliant, personalized texting at scale, turning oneway messages into meaningful conversations that move people to act.

Strategy and Execution

Audience segmentation identified residents with inconsistent off-year voting histories.

A multi-touch structured send cadence aligned messages with early-voting openings, weekend reminders, and Election-Day deadlines.

"Value, then Ask" approach. Each text focused on conversationally sharing information, diving into promoting the candidate if prompted.

Live sentiment scoring flagged inbound messages as positive, neutral, or negative, enabling rapid manual follow-ups.

Strict Opt-out language made up 31% of each initial message, keeping carrier errors low and transparency high.

RESULTS

24.1% Reply Rate

Roughly three times higher than typical political text benchmarks

69.9%

Positive sentiment

A measurement of how aligned recipients were with the candidate

43.5%

Voter Y/Y Increase

for the candidate's party, compared with the previous mayoral race, while the town total only rose by 22.7%.

Conclusion

The results demonstrate that even short sprints that are well-timed, two-way conversations can expand the electorate and mobilize infrequent voters in off-cycle elections.
